NETIQUETTE FOR ONLINE DISCUSSIONS



RULE OF THUMB

If you wouldn't do or say anything in real life, don't do it online either.



BE RESPECTFUL

Do: Respect diversity. Respect opinions that differ from your own. Politely critique a position, but not the person, when you feel the need to disagree.

Avoid: Offensive language, derogatory comments, and jokes directed at religious beliefs, disabilities, and age.



BE PROFESSIONAL

Do: Read everything in the discussion thread before replying. Stay on topic. Make the effort to be clear and to articulate your point. Check your spelling and grammar before posting.

Avoid: Writing in "texting" language. Using all capital letters, rants, profanity, or participating in hostile interactions.



BE POLITE

Do: Address others by name or appropriate title. Be mindful of your tone as written words can be easily misinterpreted without the support of facial expression and tone of voice.

Avoid: Sarcasm, swearing, or language that would be consider rude or argumentative.



BE SCHOLARLY

Do: Credit the ideas of others. Cite and link to scholarly resources.

Avoid: Misinform others when you may not know the answer. If you are not 100% sure about something, clearly state that you do not have all of the information.
